## You can Eat A shark!



Yes, it's true! With a shark cookie cutter, you can make shark sugar cookies and turn the tables on those shifty sharks! If you don't have a shark cookie cutter, trace a simple shark pattern. Then, place your pattern over the dough and make a shark!

# sand snark cookles

1 cup butter

1 cup granulated sugar

3 cups flour


1-1/2 tsp baking powder 1 egg

If you want to decorate your cookies, cut special Tip! off the white tips of candy corn to make shark teeth for your cookies! You can use a chocolate chip for the shark's eye, too!

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream butter and sugar in a large bowl. Add egg and vanilla to the butter and sugar mixture. Mix flour, baking powder, and salt in another bowl. Add the dry 1 tsp vanilla extract ingredients, a little at a time, to the butter mixture. Chill the dough in the refrigerator for one ingreusens, a nure at a time, to the putter maxture. Commune uough in the renigerator for one to two hours. Place your dough between two sheets of wax paper. Use a rolling pin to roll it 1/2 tsp salt flat to the thickness you want. Cut dough into shark shapes. Bake on an ungreased baking sheet for 8 to 10 minutes until cookies turn brown on the edges. Enjoy your sharks!

#### Tips to Find Shark Teeth



- Look in a section of the beach where you see more blackish things than shells. Look carefully, and pick up anything black.
  Works best at low tide!
- Look at the water's edge where shells and rocks are being pulled back to the ocean. If you think you see a shark tooth, grab it and all the shells around it, because it's hard to catch!
