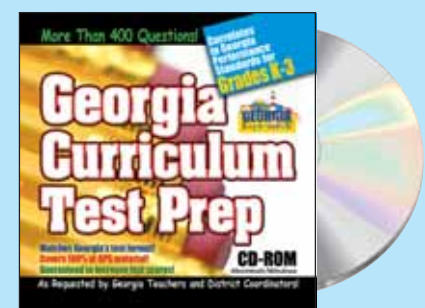
The **executive** branch carries out or enforces laws. **EXECUTIVE BRANCH**
