Bring It To Life!

- 1. Make it snow! Take white pieces of paper and fold them in half. Along the crease of your fold, cut out pretty designs. Unfold the paper and cut the rest of it to your favorite shape of snowflake!
- 2. Nick and Curie loved to play their Snow Facts game. What's a topic you know a lot about? Divide into groups and play a game using facts from your favorite subject!
- 3. Blizzards are accompanied by fierce, howling winds. Play this game called, "A Strong Wind Blows." Set up chairs in a circle with one person left over to stand in the middle. The person in the middle says, for example, "A strong wind blows for anyone who loves macaroni and cheese!" Then, anyone sitting in a chair who does love macaroni and cheese must get up and run to another chair. Whoever doesn't make it to one of the chairs is the next person in the middle to make the wind blow!
- 4. Nick and Curie felt like "walking snowmen" during that blizzard! Make your own snowmen. Design, color, glitter, and cut out your very own creative examples of snowmen. You can even make a portrait of yourself as a snowman!

Fascinating Facts Blizzards

- 1. The terrible 1888 blizzard killed at least 400 people in New York.
- 2. Barometric pressure, wind speed, and the amount of moisture in the air are all major factors in blizzard formation.
- 3. A "white out" is when the snow in the sky and the snow on the ground are so heavy that you can't see a single thing.
- 4. Ice crystals form when water vapor freezes around a piece of dust.
- 5. In cases of extremely cold temperature, you should eat little snacks frequently to keep your blood flowing to keep from freezing! Wear a hat because most of your body heat escapes through your head.

6. Sometimes the snow produced in a blizzard is so heavy that roofs collapse under its weight.

- 7. Blizzards can last for more than three hours.
- 8. It doesn't have to be snowing for a blizzard to occur. Sometimes blizzards form from strong winds blowing up already fallen snow and creating a whiteout.
- 9. If your weatherman says there is a "Winter Storm Watch," that means there is a strong possibility for severe snow. If you hear that there's a "Winter Storm Warning," that means the snowstorm has already started and will probably get worse, so you should stay inside and warm!


Winter Weather Safety Tips


