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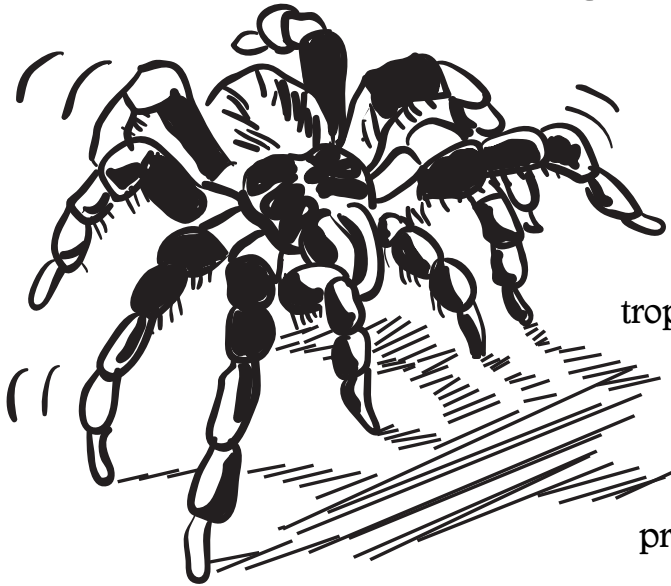
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# Amazon Trivia



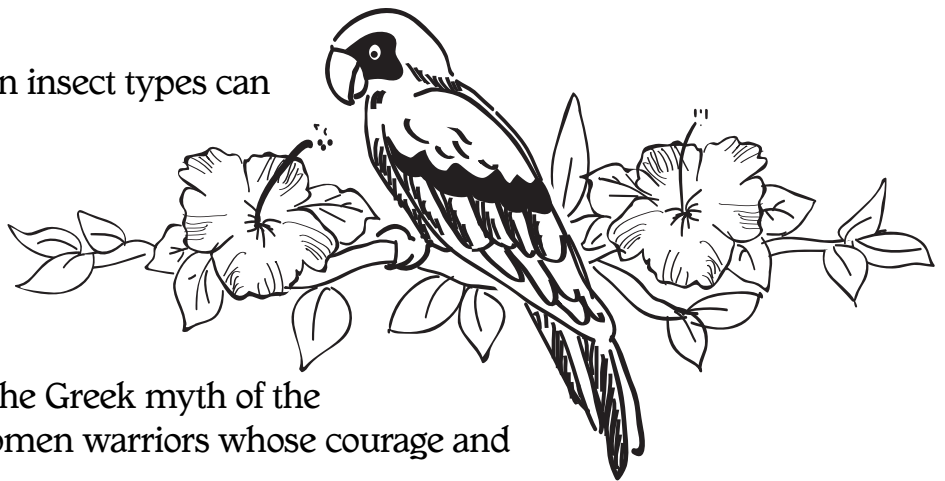
- Rainforests used to cover 14% of the earth's land surface; now they only cover 6%.
- More than half of the world's estimated 10 million species of plants, animals and insects live in the tropical rainforests.
- The Amazon gets nine feet of rain every year!
- More than 20 percent of the world oxygen is produced in the Amazon Rainforest.

• Over 500 mammals, 175 lizards and over 300 other reptiles species, and one third of the world's birds live in Amazonia.

• It is estimated that about 30 million insect types can be found here.

• The Amazon covers 2.5 million miles, about the size of the USA west of the Mississippi

• The name Amazon comes from the Greek myth of the Amazonas, who were powerful women warriors whose courage and war cries terrified their enemies.



• The Amazon forest is full of world records. It has the largest beetle, the *Titanus giganteus*, 20 centimeters long; and the smallest monkey, the sagui, or pygmy marmoset, which reaches a length of only 15 centimeters and weighs only about 100 grams.

• There are more fish species in the Amazon river system than in the entire Atlantic Ocean.

• At least 1/3 of the planet's bird species live in the Amazon rainforest.

## The Mystery of the Amazon Rainforest

### The Amazon Basin

- The world's largest rainforest is located in the Amazon Basin. It is thought to be the oldest tropical forest area in the world.
- The Amazon River is the world's second longest river. It is over 4,000 miles long.
- The Amazon River drains an area almost the size of the United States.
- The high temperatures, rainfall, and humidity in the rainforest provide excellent conditions for plant and animal life.
- There are an estimated 30 million species of insects living in the Amazon Rainforest.
- Watch out! Piranhas and giant anacondas live in the Amazon River!
- Twenty percent of the world's oxygen is produced in the Amazon Basin.
- Over 120 different types of medicines are made from materials found in the Amazon Rainforest.
- There are 750 different types of trees just in two acres of the Amazon Rainforest. That's more than all the types of trees in North America!
- One-third of all the animal species in the world live in the Amazon Basin!

## The Mystery of the Amazon Rainforest

### Brazil

- Brazil is the largest country in South America. It covers 3,300,169 square miles.
- The largest sports stadium in the world is located in Rio de Janeiro. It can seat 200,000 people!
- Brazil is the only country in Latin America where Portuguese is spoken.
- Brazil's soccer team has won the World Cup five times, more than any other country!
- Brazil is home to more than 1,000 rivers, including the great Amazon River.
- More than 800,000 dancers and over 5,000 musicians take part in Carnival in Rio de Janeiro each year. The dancing and music lasts for five days, but the participants practice all year.
- Brazil's flag is yellow, blue, and green. Yellow represents gold, blue represents the sky, and green represents the forests.
- Traditional Brazilian foods include arroz (white rice), feijao (black beans), and farinha (flour). This combination is served with meat, chicken, or fish.
- People in Brazil greet their guests by kissing them twice on each cheek.
- Brazil produces more oranges than any other country in the world.

### Peru

- An ancient civilization called the Incas used to live in Peru. They built a city named Macchu Picchu. It is the most famous tourist attraction in Peru.
- The most famous Peruvian food is called ceviche. It is marinated raw fish with onions, peppers, corn, lettuce, and potatoes.
- Spanish and Quechua, the Inca language, are the two official languages of Peru.
- Peru has three different geographical areas. They include the warm coastline, the cold Andes Mountains, and the wet Amazon plains.
- The potato is originally from Peru. Today, Peru grows over 3,000 different types of potatoes.
- Peru is home to the Plaza de Acho, the second largest bullfighting ring in the world.
- Peru's Cotahuasi Canyon is the deepest canyon in the world—even deeper than the Grand Canyon!
- Peru makes many different kinds of cereals including Kiwicha, the cereal NASA astronauts eat on their trips.
- In Peru, llamas are used to carry heavy loads. Peruvians drink their milk and eat their meat!
- Lake Titicaca is one of the highest lakes in the world. It is located in the Andes Mountains. Half of it lies in Peru, and half lies in Bolivia.

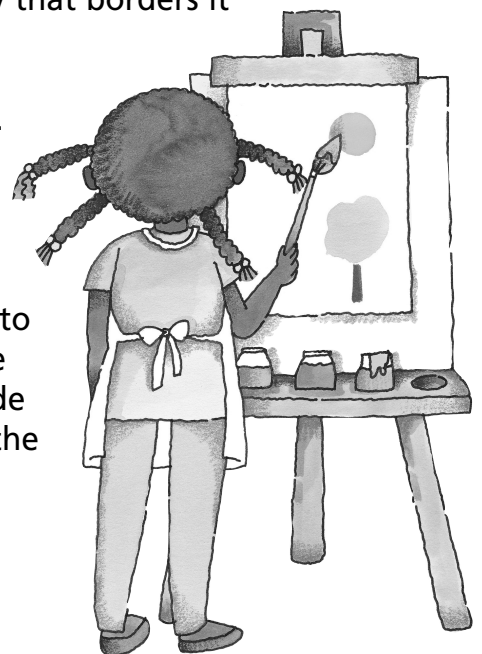


# Online Book Club
