Abraham Lincoln

Elementary Teacher Instructions and
Reproducible Activity

Students will take a letter from Abraham Lincoln's name and write a word describing Lincoln inside a log cabin drawn on a reproducible sheet.

For example, a student assigned the letter "A" might write:

A is for Ability. A is for Accomplishment. A is for Abolition. One assigned the letter "B" might write B is for Brave or Bible (because he liked to read the Bible), or Beard (because he wore a beard).

You may want to give the children a list of words to choose from.

Supplies needed: worksheet with log cabin outline on it, crayons, colored pencils

Directions:

1. Discuss accomplishments and character traits of Abraham Lincoln.
2. Hand out the worksheet with the log cabin on it.
3. Assign students one letter in Abraham Lincoln's name. Direct them to pick a word that describes him or has something to do with his life that begins with that letter. Tell them to write that letter in the cabin with the word they have chosen.
4. Allow students to color the log cabin when they have finished writing their word in it.
5. Arrange worksheets on the bulletin board in the order of the name: Abraham Lincoln.
