

## Civil War Middle School Teacher Instructions and Reproducible Activity

This activity includes a reproducible Kepi hat sheet. Students will write a vocabulary word and definition or the name of a significant person and his/her significance on the hats, and then color the hats accordingly, either blue or grey. Once this is done, the hats can be displayed on the bulletin board, giving the students a visual reminder of vocabulary and important people from the Civil War.

**Supplies needed:** vocabulary list, textbook, notes, other available reference materials, Kepi hat worksheets, pens or markers (for writing), and grey and blue crayons or colored pencils

- 1. Pass out the worksheets with the Kepi hats on them.
- 2. Have students write their names on the back of their hats.
- 3. Ask students to get out their vocabulary list, notes, textbooks, and other applicable reference materials.
- 4. Remind the students that blue Kepi hats represent the Union and grey Kepi hats represent the Confederacy.
- 5. Instruct the students to use a dark pen or black (or dark colored) marker to write a vocabulary word and definition or the name of a significant person and his/her significance on their hats and then color accordingly.
- 6. Display the finished hats on the bulletin board.
