## Hispanic Heritage Middle School Teacher Instructions and Reproducible Activity

This activity includes one reproducible Hispanic tile. Students can color the tile and then write a significant cultural or historic fact on the border surrounding the tile. The tiles can be displayed on the bulletin board to create a mosaic of tiles and facts.

**Supplies needed:** tile worksheets, crayons, colored pencils, dark pens for writing, textbooks, notes, vocabulary lists/names of significant people, and any other available reference materials

1. Instruct students to take out their notes, textbooks, and vocabulary lists/names of significant people.
2. Pass out tile worksheet to all students.
3. Ask students to write their names on the back of their tiles.
4. Explain to students that they are to write a significant cultural event or historical fact about Hispanic culture, history, people, or countries on the border surrounding their tile. Be sure to have them use dark ink when writing.

Examples: Puerto Rico became a U.S. territory in 1917.  
Cinco de Mayo is a celebration of Mexican victory.

5. Once students have written on their tiles, have them color and decorate them with bright colors.
6. Direct students to cut their tiles out and display them on the bulletin board to create a mosaic of art and information.
