Landforms

Middle School Teacher Instructions and Activity

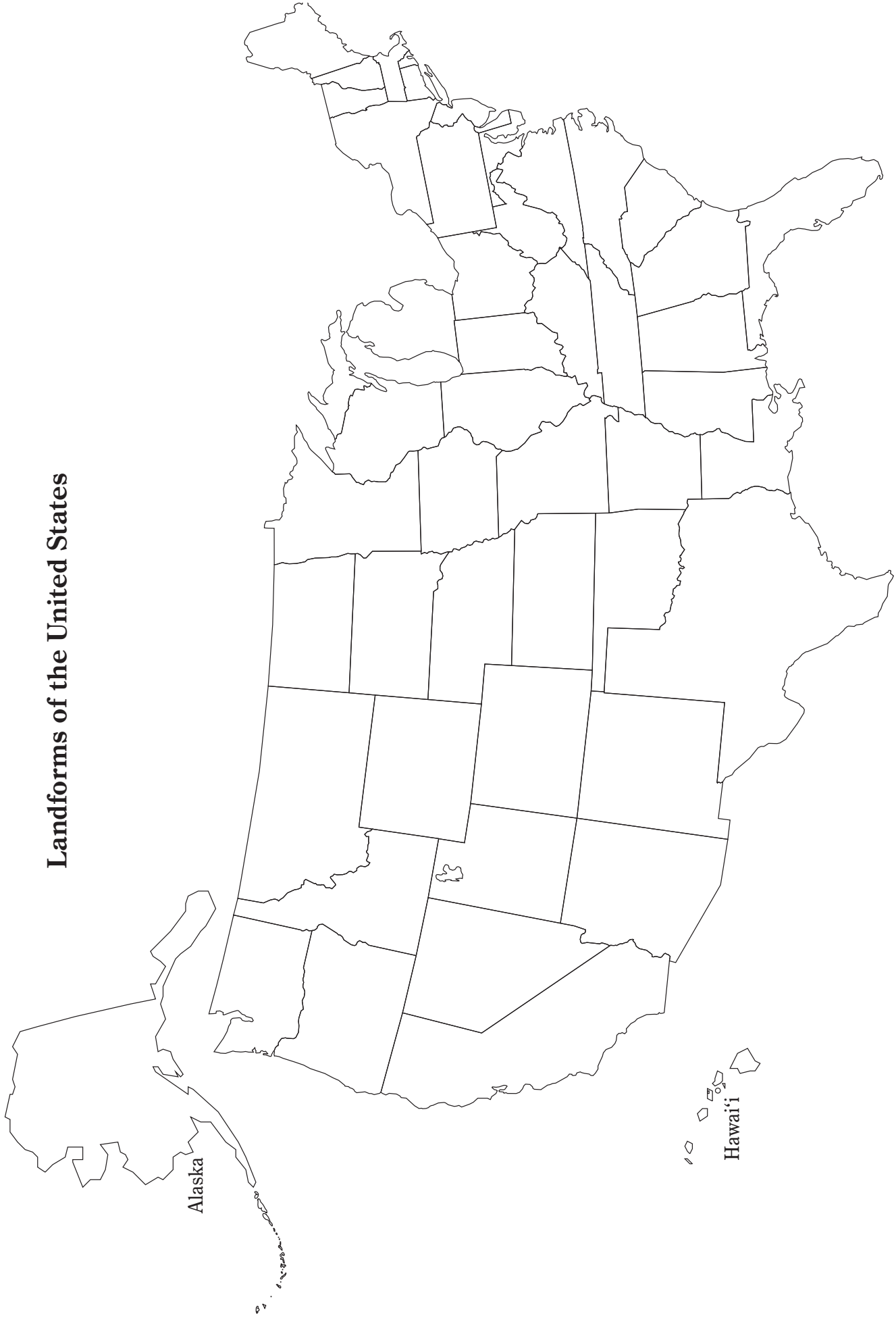
Students will label landforms of the United States on a reproducible map of the United States.

Supplies needed: pencil, crayons or colored pencils, reference material about landforms of the United States, reproducible sheet

Directions:

1. Pass out reproducible sheet with a map of the United States on it.
2. Ask students to review their reference material about landforms of the United States.
3. Instruct students to label and draw six landforms in the United States. Some landforms do not need to be drawn, such as Florida (peninsula). Others will need to be drawn, such as the Rocky Mountains. Use the bulletin board pieces for examples of landforms. The students may choose whatever landforms they wish to label. In fact, it is good if each map is different.
4. Once maps are labeled, ask students to color them.
5. Ask students to present their landforms map to the class and then hang it on the bulletin board.
